Meeting Summary

The Economic Subcommittee (“Subcommittee”) of the Georgia Child Support Commission (“Commission”) held this meeting in person at 244 Washington Street SW, Suite 300, Atlanta, GA 30334. Two (2) Subcommittee members attended the meeting. The Subcommittee members in attendance were:

Program Manager, Kurt Bryan, Staff Attorney, Noelle Lagueux-Alvarez, and Program Coordinator, Lazaro Quintanilla, served as staff for this meeting. No members of the public attended this open meeting.

Dr. Roger Tutterow called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. Dr. Tutterow noted that a quorum was met with two (2) of the three (3) Subcommittee members in attendance.

Dr. Tutterow led a discussion on beginning the process of developing the 2026 Economic Study. Dr. Tutterow noted that the study will take place per O.C.G.A. §19-6-50 and OCGA §19-6-53, and the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) at 45 CFR 302.56(e) - (h). Kurt Bryan confirmed for Dr. Tutterow that Dr. Jane Venohr is willing to conduct the 2026 Economic Study. Dr. Tutterow motioned to retain Dr. Venohr for the 2026 Economic Study, and Chuck Clay seconded the motion. Dr. Tutterow noted that the recommendation to retain Dr. Venohr will be brought to the full Commission at the next Commission meeting on August 1, 2025.

Collecting counties: Dr. Tutterow brought up selecting counties for data sampling. Kurt Bryan suggested the Subcommittee be prepared to select more counties than required. The reason is that if the Commission staff experience difficulties with 1 or more of the 16 required counties, there will be 4 additional ones to take their place. Noelle Lagueux-Alvarez confirmed that 16 counties were selected for the last economic study. Dr. Tutterow stated that random sampling would not be conducted. Instead, from the selected counties there will be representatives of each economic development district in Georgia to obtain geographic dispersion.

Dr. Tutterow brought up the point of scheduling the 2 public listening sessions to prepare for the 2026 Economic Study. One of the sessions will take place in person. The other session will happen on a Zoom Webinar call. The in-person session is set to take place in Macon, GA with a tentative date of August 27th, 2026, during lunch hours. Commission staff will confirm an exact location for the in-person session later. The Zoom Webinar Session is set to tentatively take place on August 28th, 2026, at 7:00 p.m. There will also be a place for members of the public to leave

written comments through the Commission's website for 30 days in late August/Early September. Those comments will be collected and dispersed to Commission members.

Dr. Tutterow suggested that the date for the next Economic Subcommittee meeting be decided sometime after the August 1st Commission meeting and after the listening sessions in late August. Kurt Bryan suggested September be the next month to look for a date for the next Economic Subcommittee session.

This meeting adjourned at 11:18 am.
