**Meeting Summary**

The Georgia Child Support Commission (“Commission”) held a hybrid meeting at the Nathan Deal Judicial Center in Atlanta, Georgia, and via Zoom Webinar. Five (5) Commission members attended. The Commission members in attendance were:

Program Manager Kurt Bryan, Staff Attorney JoAnna Deering, and Program Coordinator Lazaro Quintanilla served as staff for this meeting. A few members of the public were present at the meeting. Judge Key welcomed all who joined the meeting.

A quorum of nine (9) out of fifteen (15) Commission members was not established. Chair Key noted that the minutes of October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2025, Commission meeting were previously distributed to all members, and that a vote for an approval would be held via E-vote.

Kurt Bryan provided an update for the Economic Subcommittee. The Subcommittee last met on June 12, 2025. The process for the 2026 Economic Study has commenced. There have been two public listening sessions for the public to provide input. These sessions took place on August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025, and August 28, 2025. On August 27<sup>th</sup>, the session was held in person in Macon, Georgia. On August 28<sup>th</sup>, the session was held virtually via Zoom Webinar. The sessions saw a few attendees, and the written comments were also available for submission on the Commission website. Commission Staff have collected cases from all selected counties, except Cobb County. Commission Staff anticipates delivering all the relevant data to Dr. Venohr by the end of May 2026.

Regina Quick provided an update for the Technology and Calculator Subcommittee, which last met on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. Since the last meeting, AOC IT team has successfully deployed the statutory required low-income and parenting time adjustments that became effective on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026. Since the latest changes pertaining to the calculator modernization from 2025, the AOC IT team has also successfully patched minor user interface issues. The expected parenting time

calendar tool is expected to be available for testing in June of 2026 and is expected to be demonstrated for review to the subcommittee in early to mid-July 2026. Lastly, the old worksheet archival project is on track to be completed in July 2026. Commission Staff will work on providing notice to all users about the removal of old worksheets.

Katie Connell provided an update for the Statute Review Subcommittee. Since there has not been a subcommittee meeting since the last Commission meeting, the statute review subcommittee is planning to meet in the summer months of 2026. The subcommittee will discuss statutory language and plans for the next legislative session.

There were no public comments made by those in attendance.

The Commission plans to meet again in late September or early October of 2026. Commission Staff will coordinate with members to set the date.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:18 a.m.
